# Let's Sticker & Paste!



Your child will develop fine motor control skills while having fun with stickers and learning to paste with glue.

# Kumon First Steps Workbooks help children develop fine motor skills as preparation for writing letters and numbers.

## Special features of this book

1. This book's simple design can help children as young as two learn important basic skills while having fun.
2. This book allows parents and children to share meaningful playtime together.
3. This book is structured so that your child will develop fine motor control skills while acquiring new vocabulary.

## The aims and purpose of this book

### ■ Develop fine motor skills

Your child will improve finger strength and dexterity. This will help your child hold and use a pencil correctly, which is an important skill for more advanced learning.

### ■ Improve pasting skills

If your child can put glue on pieces of paper and paste them onto designated areas, then he or she has mastered basic pasting skills. In general, young children usually develop pasting skills in the following order:

1. Peeling off stickers and pasting them.
2. Pasting stickers and paper parts onto matching shapes.
3. Putting glue on small parts and pasting them onto designated areas.

The exercises in this book are designed to take your child through each of the above

skills, step by step, so that he or she masters each one before moving on. Learning to paste with stickers and glue allows your child to improve his or her ability to concentrate and focus.

### ■ Enhancing children's sense of shape and positioning abilities

Your child will learn to associate words such as "circle" and "square" with the actual shapes that the words represent. He or she will learn to paste matching shapes together as well as paste big and small strips of paper onto a background image. Your child's creativity and shape composition ability will be greatly enhanced. In addition, through learning to paste stickers or paper parts onto designated areas, he or she will develop positioning abilities.

## How to use this book

1. To make the exercises easier for your child, please cut out the illustrated portion of each page for him or her.
2. Your child will practice pasting stickers at the beginning of this book. It may be a good idea to peel off the appropriate stickers from each sheet for your child. Some pages contain directions for parents to cut out parts. Please enjoy the process of completing the exercises together with your child.
3. When your child has completed each page, please offer him or her lots of praise.
4. Please refer to the "To parents" notes in this book, which provide more comments and advice on how to help your child enjoy and learn from this book.
5. Try to limit the number of pages your child will complete in a day. It is best to end the day's work when your child still wants to do more.

# How to use this book



## Relax and enjoy!

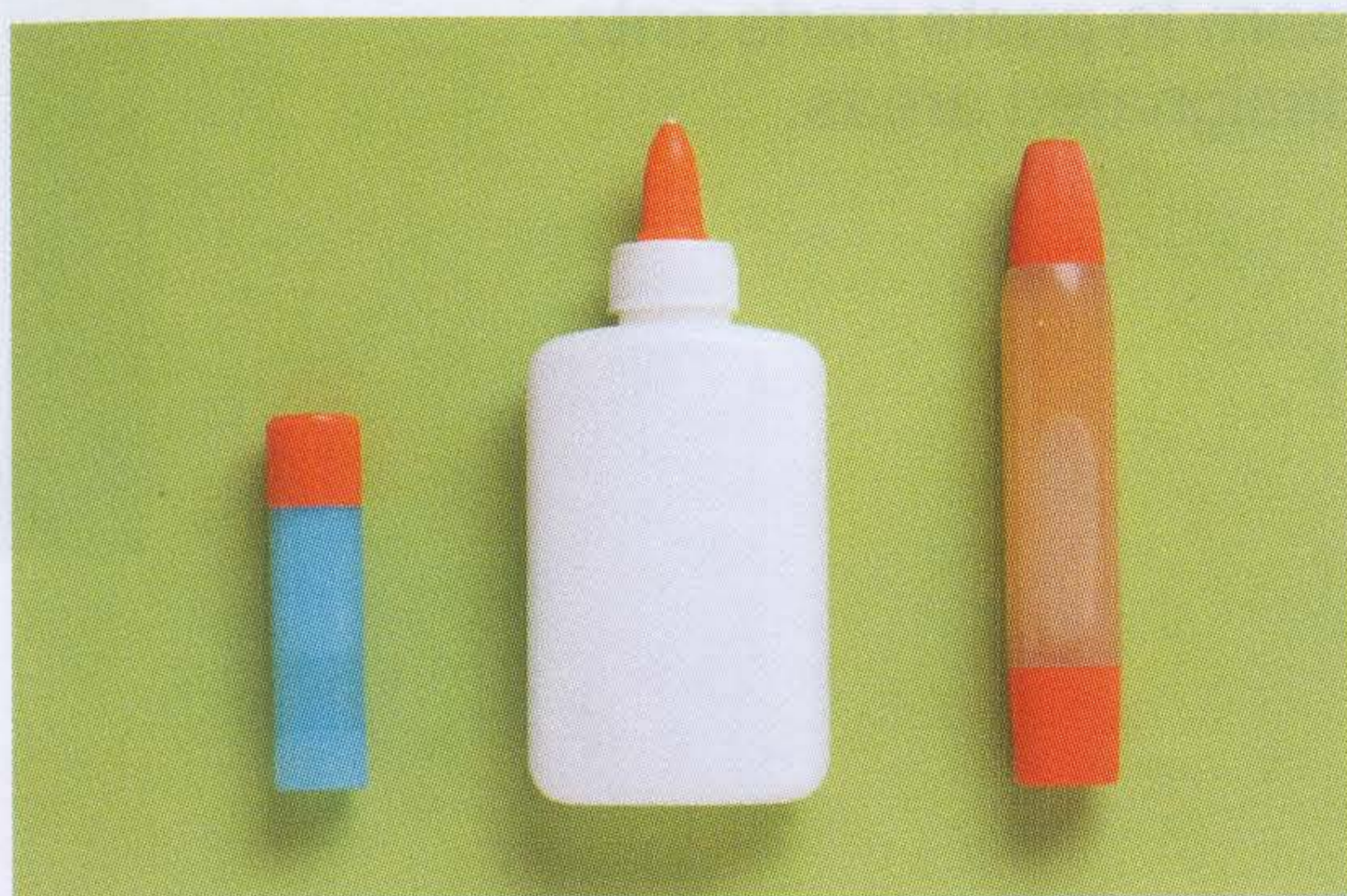
Kumon's First Steps Workbooks are designed so that children and parents can learn and have fun together. Children learn best from active and participatory parents, so please help your child with the activities in this book. By helping your child, you are encouraging him or her to develop a desire to learn, as well as laying the foundation for your child to become a self-motivated learner.

## How to choose glue

Please avoid using glue with a strong smell. Choose a child-safe product in an easy-to-use container. You can use a glue stick, but for children, it is best to use glue that can be applied by hand. Children enjoy the tactile experience of spreading glue with their fingers.

## Tips for pasting

Line your table with scrap paper before your child starts. Have your child apply an appropriate amount of glue onto the tip of his or her middle finger, and spread it thinly on the paper. Your child can spread the glue evenly by using his or her middle finger, with the forefinger placed above it, and making spiral movements. However, as this is a fairly advanced skill, it is okay for your child to just use one finger. As for parts with a glue mark on the back, please put glue on that side. When your child pastes parts onto paper, encourage him or her to hold the paper with one hand and apply the glue with the other. As this is difficult for small children, you can hold the paper for your child at first.

## How to paste

Your child may already be familiar with playing with stickers, but perhaps he or she is used to just pasting them randomly. It may be difficult at first for your child to paste stickers on designated places, but be patient. In time, your child will master this skill.

It does not matter if your child cannot paste accurately or if the image he or she has created is not perfect. He or she will gradually learn to paste parts onto designated areas.



When your child is first attempting to paste a part onto a background, encourage him or her to place the edges down first and then slowly press the rest of the part into place. Your child will gradually learn how to align and paste parts onto designated areas.

### To parents

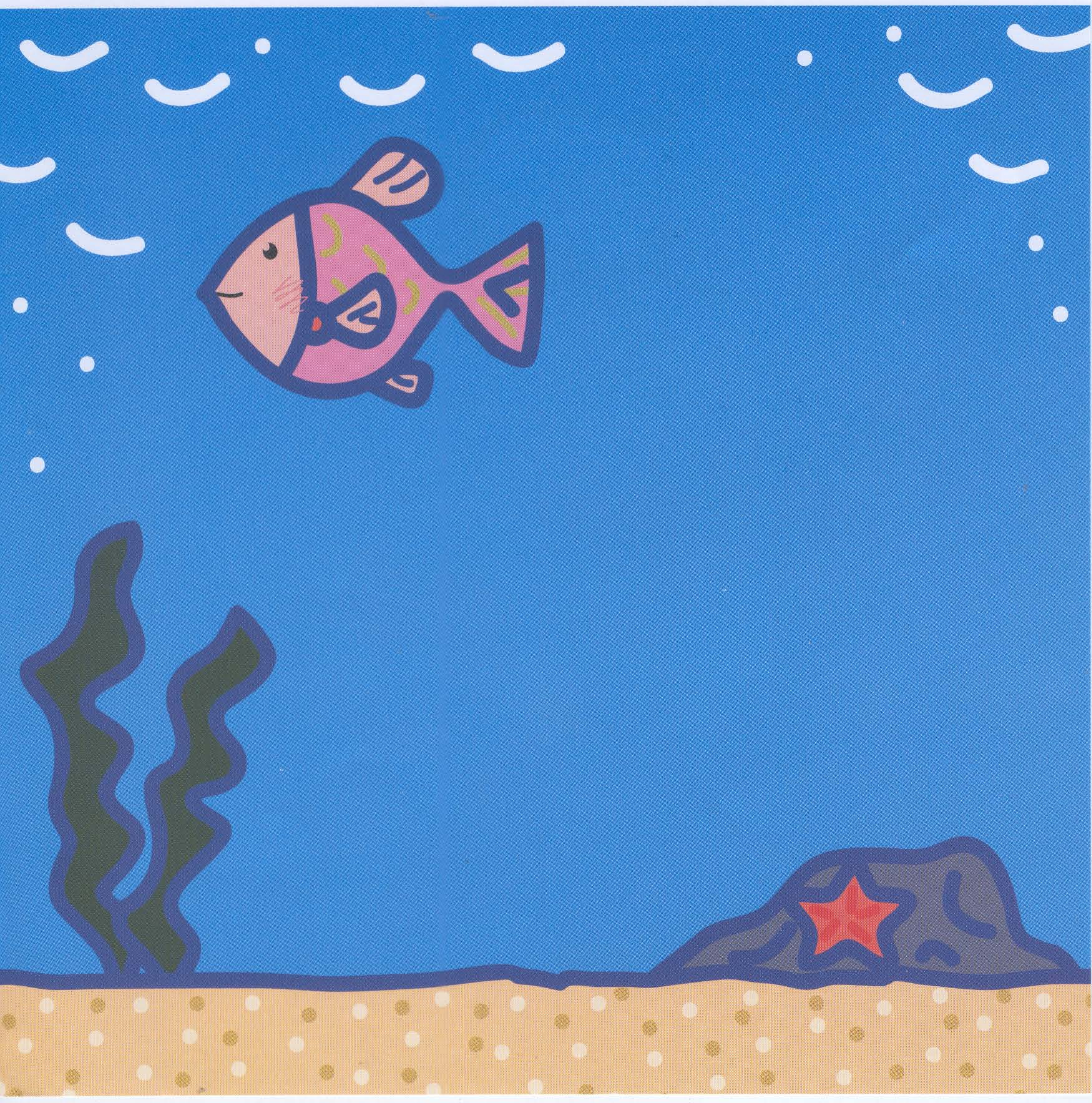

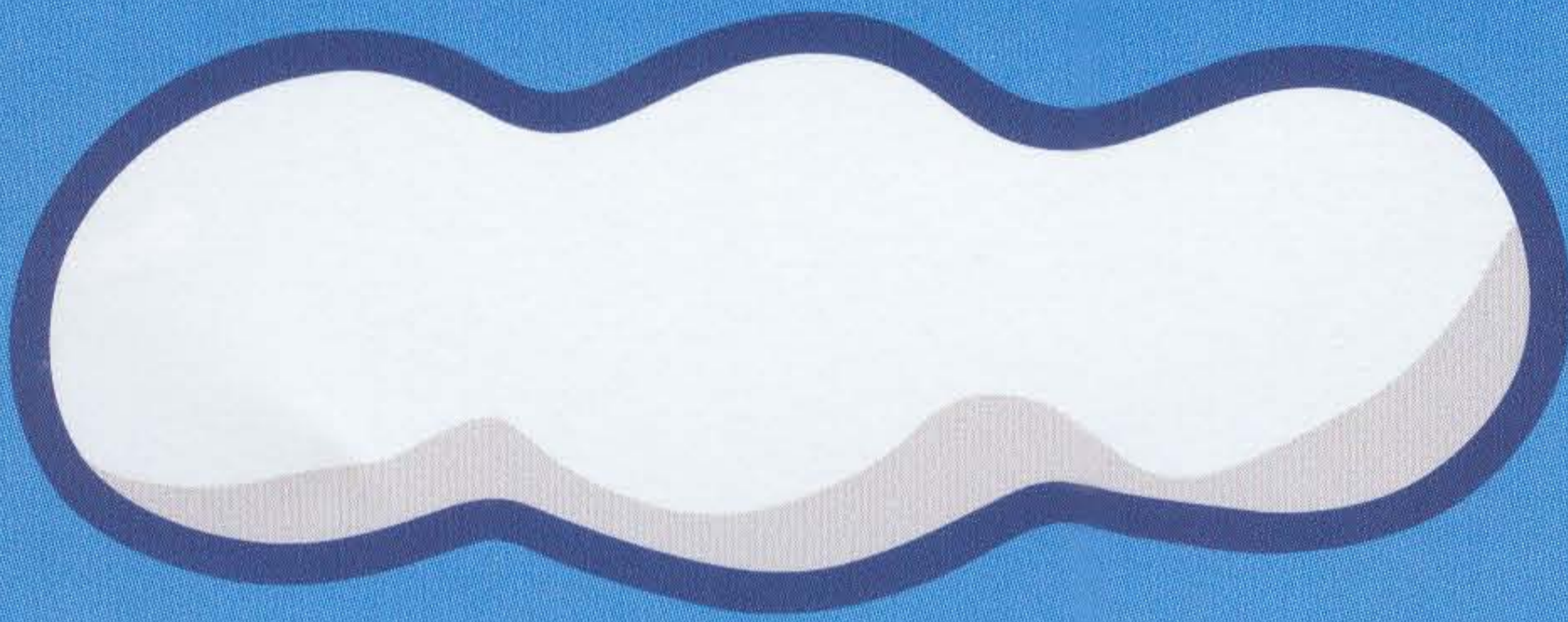
Encourage your child to peel the stickers off slowly and carefully so that they will not tear. Talk about the image he or she has created and say "sky" aloud while pointing to the word.

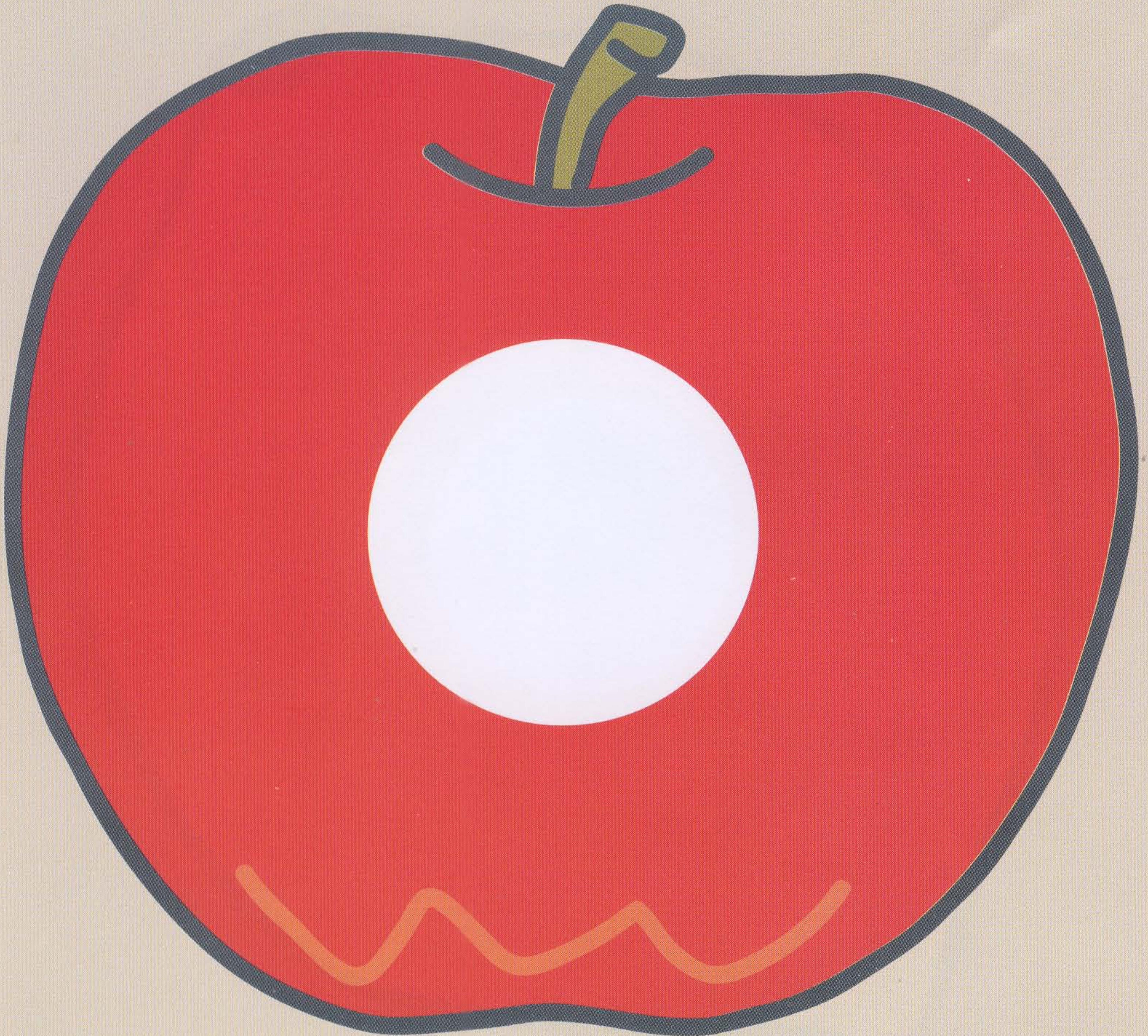


### To parents

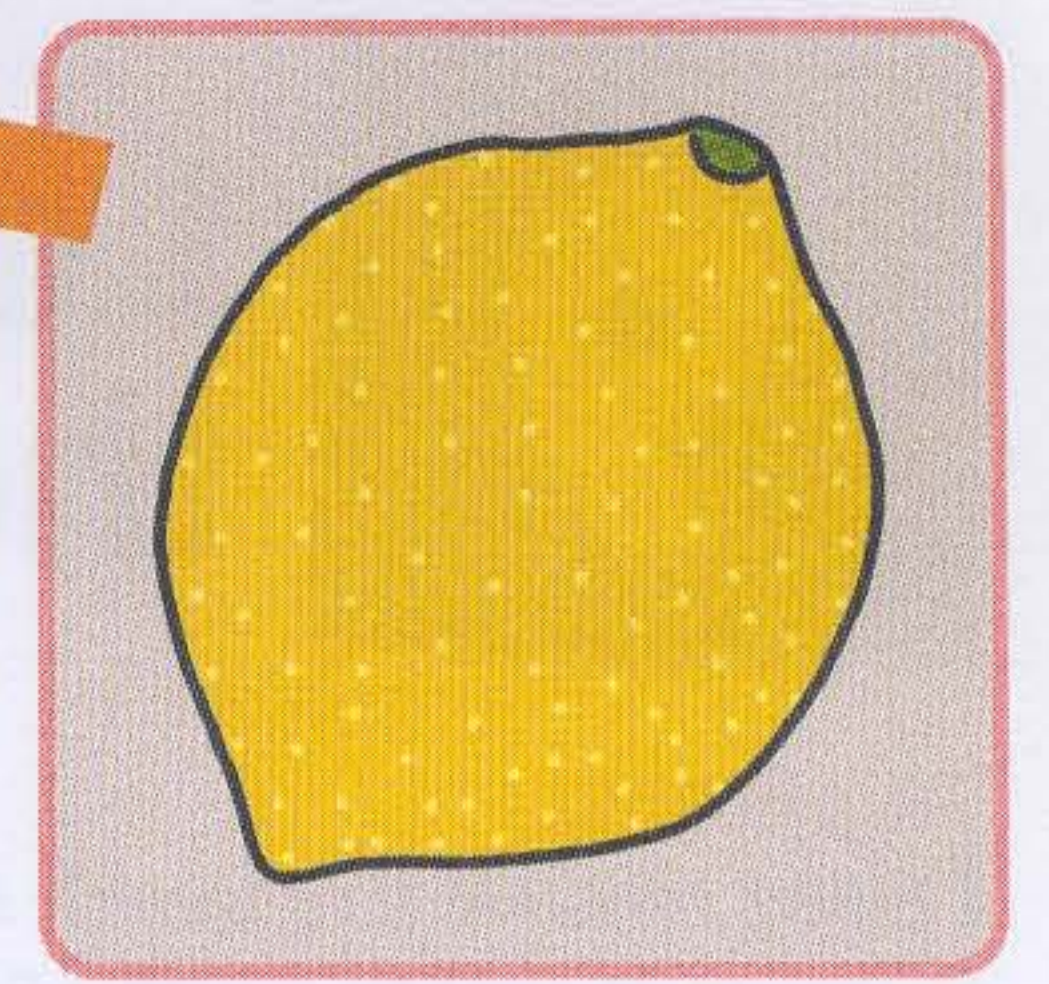

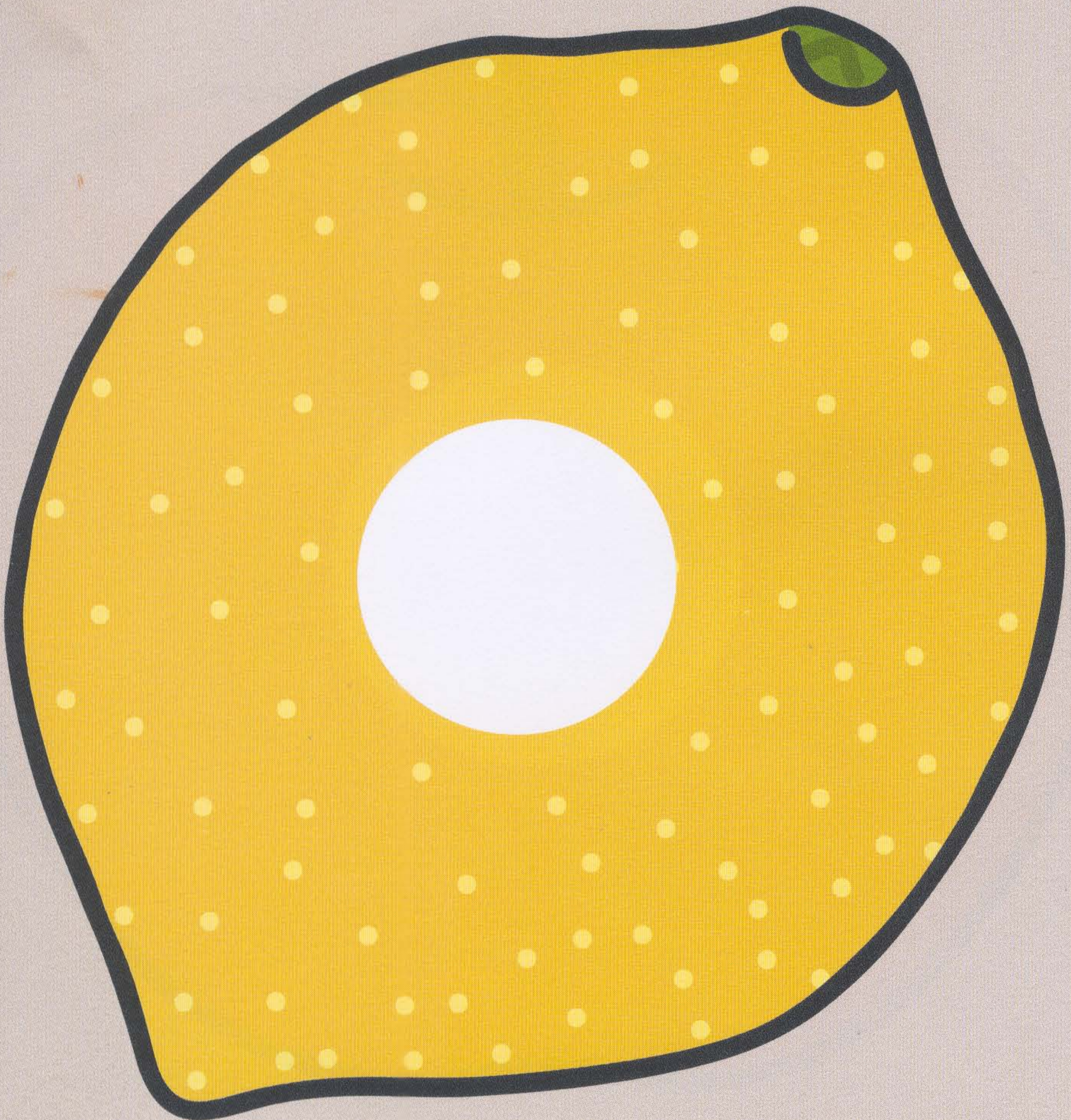

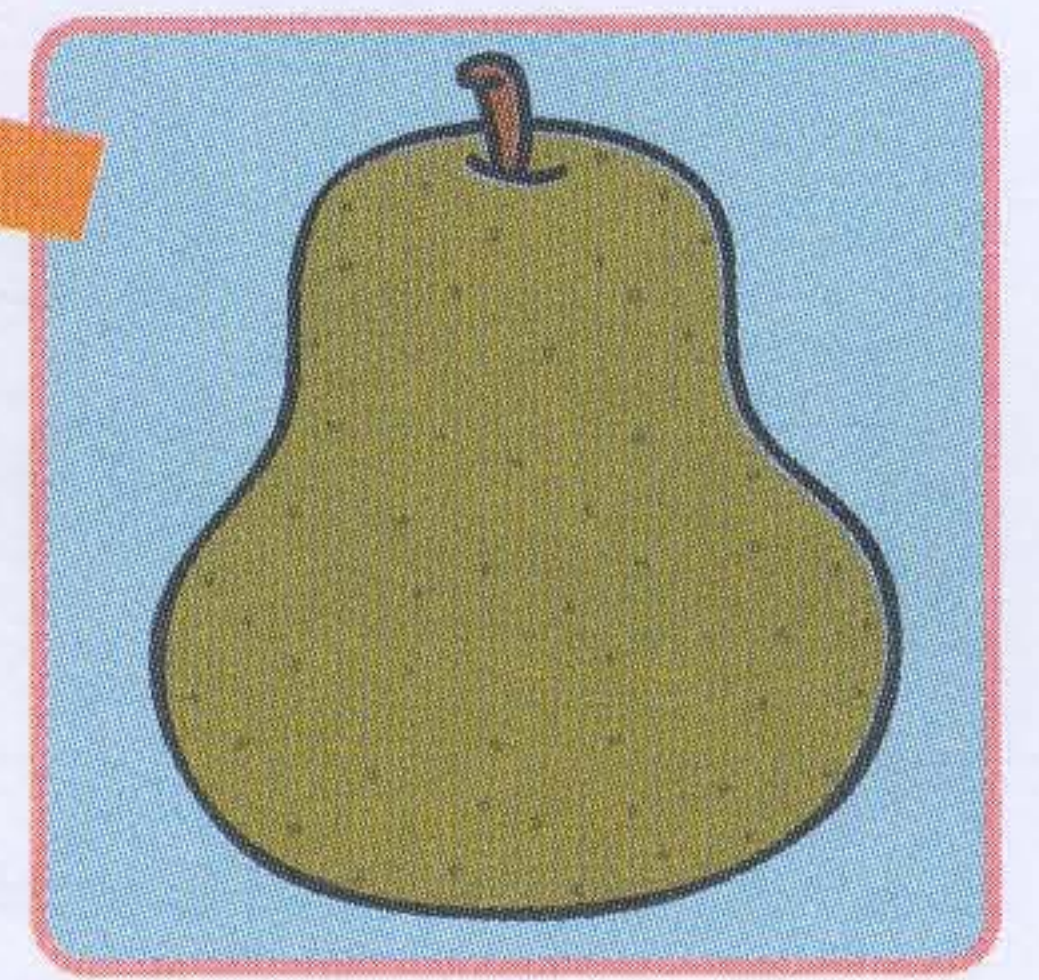

## To parents

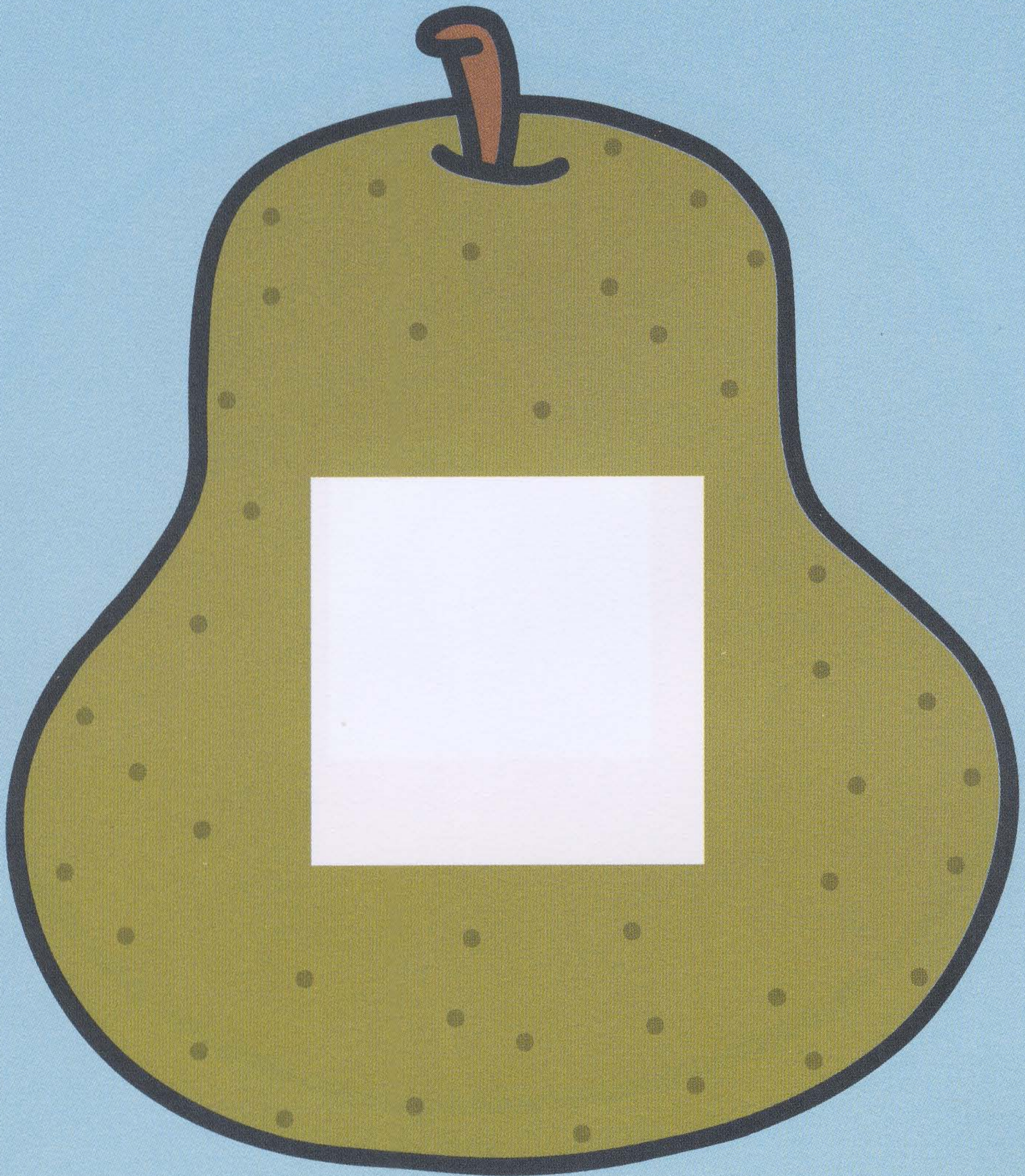

## Let's Complete the Carrot

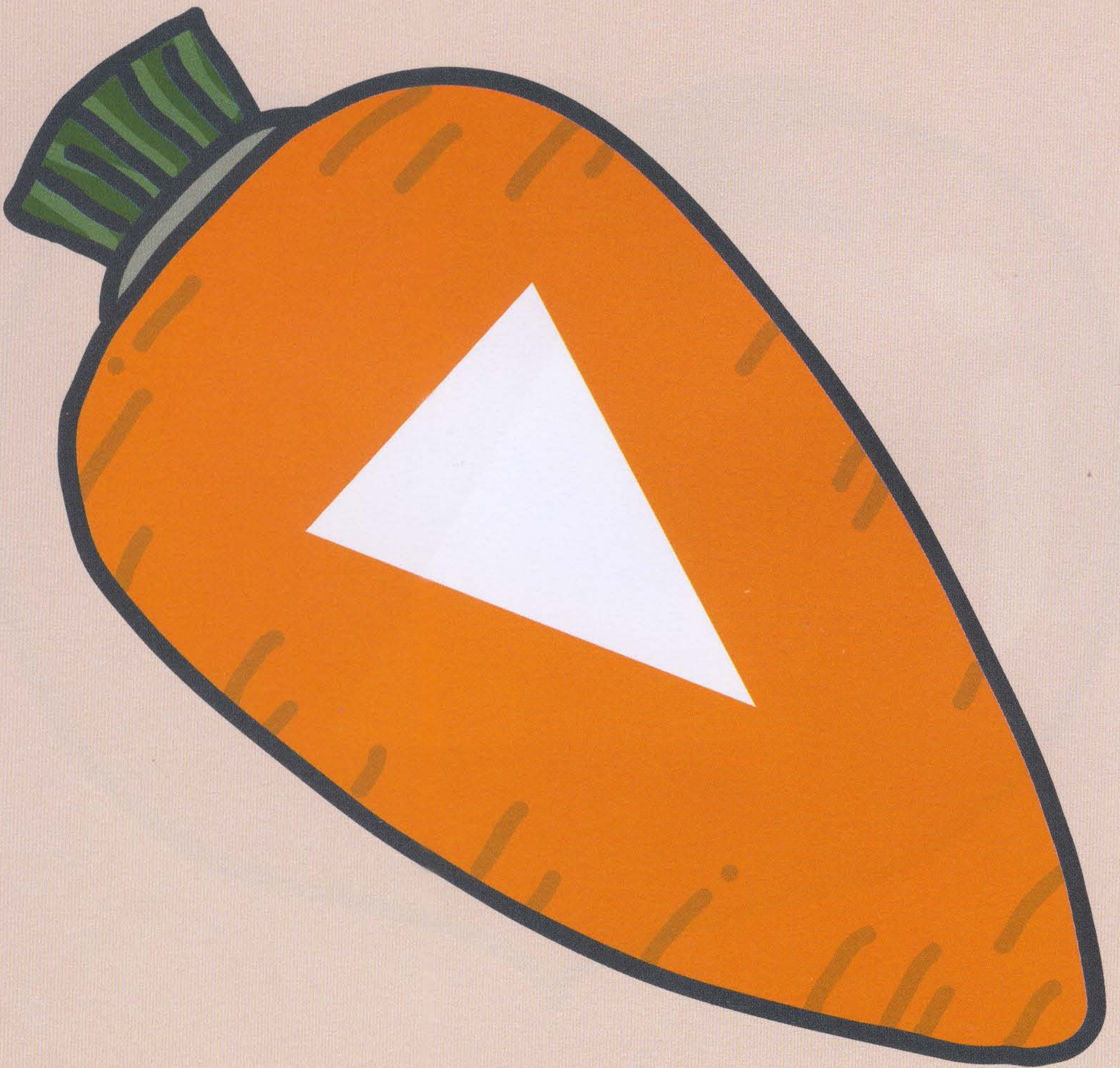

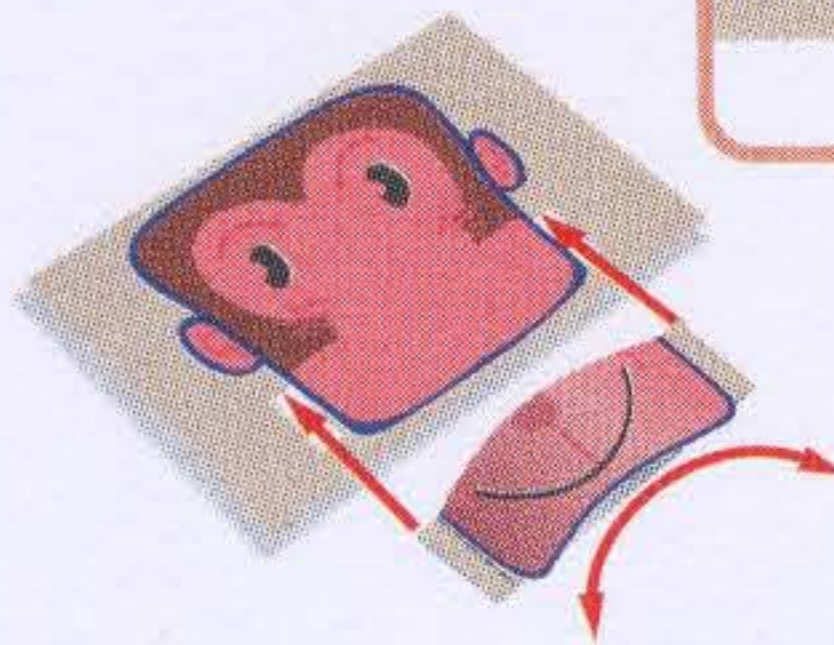
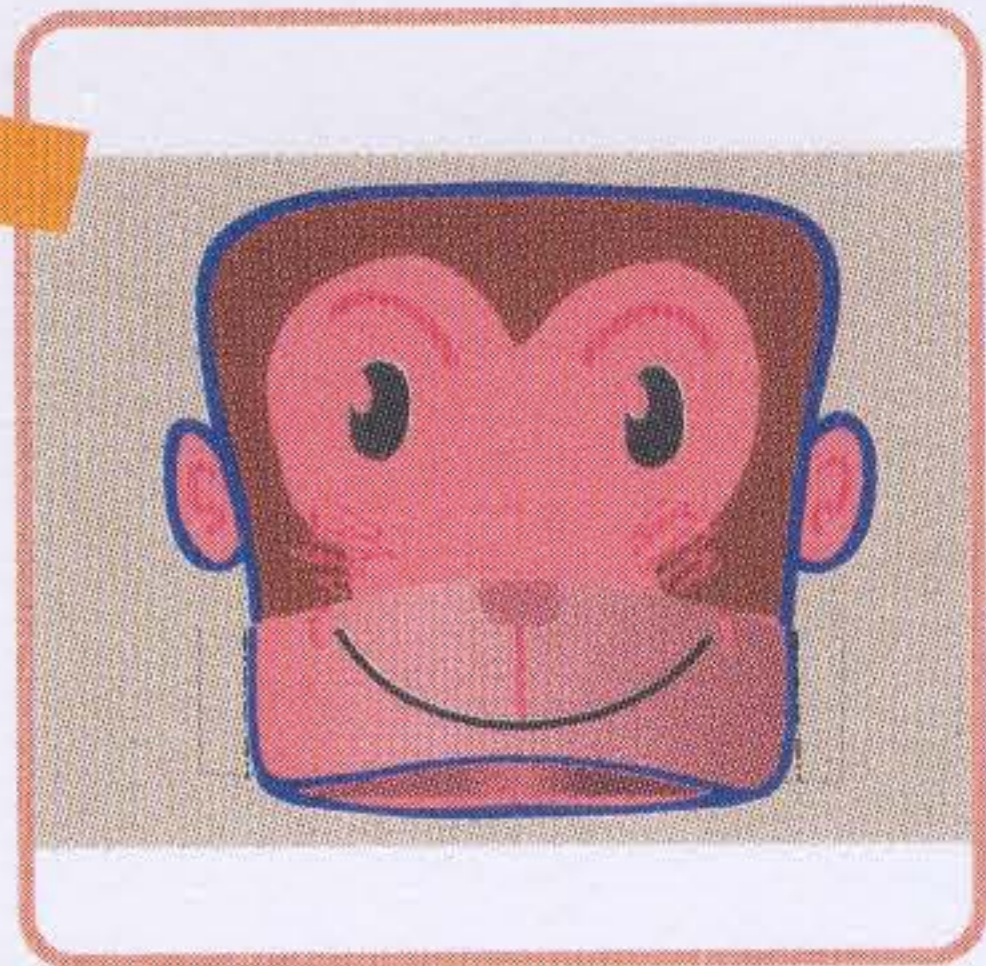
# Let's Paste the Monkey's Mouth
